Sale of Timber Klamath Indian Reservation, Big Bend Logging Unit. Sealed bids marked outside "Bid, Big Bend Logging Unit" and addressed to the Superintendent of the Klamath Indian School, Klamath Agency, Oregon, will be received until twelve o'clock noon, Pacific time, Saturday, June 7, 1919, for the purchase of timber upon about 600 acres within Townships 34 and 35 south, Range 7 east. The sale embraces approximately six million feet of yellow pine. Each bid must state the amount per thousand feet Scribner decimal C log scale that will be paid for all timber cut. No bid of less than three dollars and seventy-five cents per M feet for yellow pine will be considered. Each bid must be submitted in duplicate and be accompanied by a certified check on a solvent national bank in favor of the Superintendent of the Klamath Indian school in the amount of \$2,000. The deposit will be returned if the bid is rejected but retained if the bid is accepted, and the required contract and bond are not executed and presented for approval within thirty days from such acceptance. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. For copies of the bid and contract forms and for other information, application should be made to the Indian Superintendent, Klamath Agency, Oregon.
