BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, That said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of 10th street from Main street northerly to Prospect street and High street from 9th street easterly to 11th street, including intersections, be and the same are hereby approved, and.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Common Council hereby declare its intention to improve said portions of 10th street and High street in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates. Said improvements to consist of paving said portions of said street with oil macadam pavement at a estimated cost, including cement side walks, concrete curbing and grading, of \$35,429.00; or concrete pavement at an estimated cost including cement walks, concrete curbing and grading, of \$40,360.00; or bitulithic pavement at an estimated cost, including cement side walks, concrete curbing and grading, of \$46,407.00. The City Engineer, pursuant to Resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having on the 15th day of April, 1919, filed plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of improving 8th street from High street northerly to Prospect street inclusive, Lincoln st. from 8th street easterly to 9th street and Jefferson street from 8th easterly to 9th street, including intersections, and the Council having taken same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, That said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of the said portions of 8th, Lincoln and Jefferson streets be and the same are hereby approved, and.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of 8th, Lincoln and Jefferson streets, in accordance with the said plans, specifications and estimates. Said improvements to consist of paving said portions of said streets with oil macadam pavement at an estimated cost, including cement side walks, curbing and grading, of \$22,010.00; bitulithic pavement at the estimated cost, including cement side walks, curbing and grading, of \$29,589.00; or concrete pavement at the estimated cost, including cement side walks, curbing and grading, of \$25,176.00. BIG PLANS ARE MADE FOR STATE FAIR AT SALEM

SALEM, May 10.—As good as any of the promise of the grand circuit at the Oregon state fair this year. Due to better railroad facilities the livestock exhibit will be ahead of that of any previous fair. Counties that have not exhibited for years in the agricultural and horticultural departments have already secured space, and the general agricultural display will be enhanced by the addition of an entirely new show put on by the leading government agency, an organization representing Western Canada. A new feature at the racing course will be chariot races, and Secretary A. H. Lea is strongly in the notion of putting on automobile races. The fair opens September 22 and runs for a week.

Because of the lack of labor the railroads last year were unable to give the best of service in transporting livestock to the Oregon exposition, but railroad men say help is plentiful this year, and leading railroad men of the state have promised Secretary Lea their personal attention to the service.
