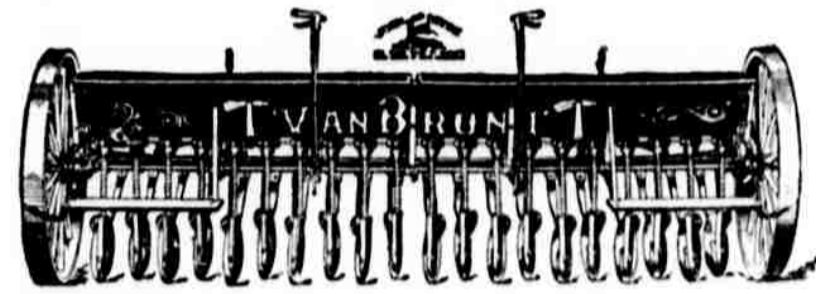
PARIS, May 13.—Heads of three German parties have notified the Chancellor that their parties will withdraw from the Government if the Cabinet declines to sign the treaty.
