NEW HOMESTEAD RULINGS MADE

SETTLERS IN KLAMATH COUNTY ARE AFFECTED. MORE LENIENT REGULATIONS CONCERNING RESIDENCE GIVEN

According to new Circular No. 634 just received by United States Commissioner Bert C. Thomas from the General Land Office, homesteaders in Klamath County may have their period of residence reduced from seven months each year as heretofore to six or even five months per year when climatic conditions make it a hardship upon the entryman to require a residence of seven months each year until proof.

The Act of February 25, 1919, under which these new regulations are promulgated reads as follows:

Provided, that the register and receiver of the local land office under rules and regulations made by the Commissioner of the General Land Office may upon proper showing, upon application of the homesteader and only for climatic conditions, which make residence on the homestead for seven months in each year a hardship reduce the term of residence to not more than six months in each year, over a period of four years, or to not more than five months each year over a period of five years, but the total residence required shall be in no event exceed twenty-five months, not less than five of which shall be in each year; proof to be made within five years after entry.

Forms approved by the Secretary of the Interior must be made out by the applicant and signed by two corroborating witnesses, and must be filed within one year after the allowance of the entry of applicant. Leave of absence from the claim under this Act must be taken in one period and may not be taken in two periods as formerly. Credit on account of military service will be allowed as in other entries, but at least one year's compliance with the requirements of the homestead laws must be shown by each entryman claiming credit for military service.

COST
