The more careful and experienced drivers control the speed of the car more by the proper use of the throttle than by the harsh use of the foot or emergency brakes. To suddenly dart forward and then suddenly lock the wheels is a strain upon the entire car and more especially upon the tires. When the wheels are locked they slide over the surface of the road or street with the momentum and weight of the car dragging one way and the brakes holding them solid. This produces the same effect as applying an emery wheel to the surface of the tire in one If you caught anyone doing this to your tires you would have them arrested for malicious destruction of property. But when you apply your brakes and lock the wheels you are unconsciously doing the same thing. In addition you subject the tread to a tremendous tearing strain which may tend to separate the tread from the carcass of the tire.

"The more careful drivers never lock their wheels except in an emergency and they are repaid by much longer tire mileage.
