FULL HEARING WILL BE GIVEN TO COMMISSION

SALEM, Or., May 20.—No action will be taken by Governor Olcott on charges that have been made against the state fish and game commission by the Multnomah Anglers' club until "a full, frank, free and above board hearing is had." This is the substance of the letter addressed by the governor to R. W. Price, of Portland, president of the Anglers' club. The governor declares that no snap judgment will be taken. On May 12, Mr. Price sent a communication to the governor enclosing resolutions adopted by the club urging speedy action.

"Some time ago a hearing date was set at which it was the plan that all details of the fish and game situation be given a full and complete airing," the governor writes. "You, and every one interested were notified of such prospective hearing. Commissioner Warren was suddenly called to the East and the hearing was postponed until such time as he could return. You and everyone in interest were then further advised that nothing would be done until Mr. Warren's return, at which time a hearing date would be set. There has been no change in the plan.
