

## GOOD WORD FOR KLAMATH FROM PORTLAND MAN

KLAMATH, May 22.—Assistant United States Attorney Barnett Goldstein has returned from Klamath Falls, where he was called to conduct a hearing of a charge against Willard Latches, Klamath reservation Indian, of shooting at DeFord Lang, another Indian. Latches says he shot to scare Lang when the latter threatened to attack him with a pitchfork. Latches was bound over and will be tried in federal court here. Goldstein also appeared in the case against Pete Beck of Chiloquin, who is charged with selling whisky to Indians and also of transporting liquor into the state. Beck also was bound over.

Goldstein was escorted over some of the farming sections of Klamath county. He says crop conditions are excellent.

"Klamath county should become a great agricultural section when more of its land is reclaimed," he said. "Already several important irrigation projects have been developed and are producing big crops. I learned why it is that California has been seeking to annex Klamath county."

That section certainly is worth cultivating by Portland business interests.

### BULL CALF PRICE \$25,000.

MADISON, N. J., May 21.—Florham leader, a two-months old Guernsey bull calf, was sold at auction here for \$25,000, said to be a new record price for any animal of its breed. Oaks Farms and Hugh Bancroft, both of Massachusetts, combined to make the purchase, paying \$10,500 above the previous record price.

### FISHING GOOD IN KLAMATH

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., May 21.—California anglers have had a disappointing season thus far in the matter of their favorite sport. Reports from practically every section of the state are to the effect that streams still are too high for good fishing and the fish are running unusually small.

These conditions are expected to improve as the streams fall and in another week or two good sport is anticipated. The best fishing of the season thus far has been found in the Sacramento river in the dry region and in the Klamath region.


