LYONS, France, May 24. From silk pagamas fringed with lace to concrete floors of a square, Loup identifies the transition of a number of United States army aviators who commandeered the belongings of a French count here, while the latter had left his chateau for the front.

Report from Warsaw state that Ignace Jan Paderewski, Premier of Poland, narrowly escaped assassination at the hands of two men supposed to be Bolshevick emissaries, on his return to the Polish capital from Paris, where he had been attending the Peace Conference. Two men how drew revolvers as the premier and Madame Paderewski stepped from a train, were pounced upon and disarmed by guards before they could fire. The pianist-premier walked quietly to the street, where a crowd of several thousands had been waiting to greet him.

WASHINGTON, May 27. Women are permitted to participate in the affairs of the Republican party on full equality with men. They came to just the same as other voters according to National Chairman Will H. Hays in a statement today at the opening of the conference of the party workers at the Wardman Park Inn in this city.

The women are not to receive secondary consideration, Hays said, but that full consideration equal all other individuals in the party. They will not be distinctly classed as 2nd or 3rd rank.
