FRED RETURNS WITH BERRIES FOR CANNING

Makes Big Deal For His Customers

GOOD FOR TEN DAYS

Starts Out Determined to Cut the High Cost of Living for the People of This City, and Is Very Successful.

KLAMATH FALLS, May 28—(Special Announcement)—F. H. Garich, proprietor of The News and the big grocery store next door to the postoffice, has made

another ten-strike in his determination to hammer down the high cost of living. Realizing that the cost of strawberries was 'out of sight,' he hopped into his car and beat it for the Rogue River valley. There he made a deal that will be good for only 10 days. Here is the plan:

If you want strawberries for canning, get your order in now and it will be filled any time you say, within the next ten days. The price per crate will be \$2.45, delivered to your door.

To make sure that his customers will get berries that are ripe, fresh and perfect in every way, Mr. Garich made it a condition of the deal that the berries are to be picked before 7 o'clock in the morning, and shipped the same day they are picked. Thus they reach here about 12 hours after being taken from the vine. That's going some.

Mr. Garich has the highest grade cane sugar for canning these berries, which he will sell at \$11.50 the sack.
