## ELKS OUT FOR EXTRA ROOMS

AUGUST MUST BE HOUSED.  
PEOPLE OF CITY WILL BE  
ASKED TO ASSIST

Although the city is filled to the overflowing with people and more are coming in each day, making the matter of housing the population very difficult, a strenuous and systematic effort is to be put forth by the members of the Elks Lodge to take care of the thousands of visitors who are going to come in for the meeting of the State Association during the middle of the month of August.

A large number have signified their intention of coming by auto and bringing their camp outfits with them and plans are also under way to run in special trains, as is done at the Pendleton Roundup, which will remain during the Convention, allowing the visitors to sleep and eat as if on the road, but there will be a vast number to take care of in addition to this and the reputation of the city for hospitality, is at stake in meeting the problem.

A house to house canvass will be made by a committee under the leadership of James Driscoll and George Chastain in which every available room in the city will be listed and the terms under which it can be obtained.

When the visitors arrive, they will be assigned a place to go and be sent in company with one of the local men, who will see that the visitor is

comfortably quartered. In this way the whereabouts of each man will be known at headquarters in case of messages from home or other points.

The canvass is to be made under the leadership of Mr. Driscoll and the records are to be completed and

filed by Mr. Chastain. It is hoped that the people of Klamath Falls will respond to the call of the Elks in this matter and help boost the affair which is going to be one of the best things that ever happened to the city.
