On this point the Oregonian says

"If the land reclamation and soldier settlement bill, which will surely pass congress, is to be efficiently administered, the execution of the law will have to be entrusted in a large degree to authorities in the states where the lands lie, not centered in Washington. The chief cause of the growing inefficiency and extravagance of the government is centralization of all authority in the capital This practice has made the government such a huge machine that it moves more slowly just when the needs of the time demand that it speed up Every move must be approved by so many officials that it is inordinately delayed. Each official is jealous of bis little bit of authority, but seeks to evade responsibility, hence frequent postponement of decisions. A horde of subordinates has been appointed thru political favor in disregard of the civil service law, patronage has Frow: 's enormous proportions; and the government machine includes so many persons as to constitute danger to the freedom of the people - It suf-"Land reclamation and settlement of a very large measure of authority to the states or to sub-commissions which should contract for improvement of land, should supervise the work and should locate settlers on "he land and make financial arrangements with them. References of all these atfairs to Washington would result in delay, confusion, and often in things not being done at all. How can a man in Washington direct while ly what is done in Oregon or Louisiana except in the most general way? The man to run things is the man on the ground. The man in Washington needs only to see that the local men conform with the law and with general policy-he needs to co-ordinate the efforts of all and to apportion funds among them. "Other countries have passed or are passing similar laws, and they carry out their plans thru the local authorities. Great Britain is only a fraction of the size of this country and could better manage its soldier settlement and housing schemes thru the central government than this nation can But it simply passes a general law which practically enables the county councils to huy, improveand settio land, and another law enabling othes and boroughs to build houses.
