

NARROW ESCAPE IN AUTO SMASH

M. MATT IS KNOCKED FROM HIS WAGON AND DRAGGED BY HIS FRIGHTENED HORSE. ESCAPES WITHOUT INJURY

What might have resulted in a serious accident, fortunately for all concerned amounted only to a severe shaking up when an automobile, driven by Mrs. William Caldwell hit the wagon being driven by M. Matt, throwing the driver to the ground and frightening the horse so that it dragged Mr. Matt a considerable distance before being stopped. The accident occurred at the corner of Pine and Eighth Streets. Mrs. Caldwell was on her way to her home near Shippington. She states that she was not traveling at an unreasonable speed and that the accident was due to a pile of rocks that were left on the street by reason of an opening that had been made by the California, Oregon Power company.

A break in the water main had occurred at this point, and the company had had the street opened to make repairs. In replacing the dirt the rocks from the paving were piled on top of the opening and left there for the purpose of replacement. Mrs. Caldwell claims that when she hit the rock it destroyed her control of the machine and before she could regain it she had hit the wagon.

Mr. Matt states that she was traveling faster than she should be going, especially in view of the fact that she could see the rocks, that the street narrowed at this point and that a truck was approaching that would make it necessary for her to drive very slowly in order to safely pass. He further states that if he had not succeeded in turning his horse up on the parking, the machine would undoubtedly have killed the animal.
