government provided that the six thousand acres of marsh land belonging to A. C. Marsters and 12,000 acres belonging to the Weed estate be included in the dyke. It was necessary for us to exclude these lands from the dyke as proposed in our bid, as Mr. Rosborough, on behalf of the California Oregon Power Company would aid in dyking them. Mr. Rosborough stated that his company would have been glad to co-operate with us if he had met us earlier, but that his company was already working with Mr. Doak and Mr. Brown, and that in fact he was putting in their bid for them. Mr. Rosborough was in this statement, but should have added "would have been glad to co-operate providing we did not insist upon the right to use all boats on such grasses as clover and timothy."

Putting wild hay now and then and getting a little pasture off reclaimed marsh land is not our line of farming as any one can see for himself if he visits our farm. We could never co-operate in a deal of this nature with the California Oregon Power Company, because of the divergent interests. We being interested in sending farm products to San Francisco and elsewhere and not in selling "juice" there.

"It is not my suggestion that the gentlemen now associated with the California Oregon Power Company or the Reclamation Service are knowingly co-operating with the company in its heretofore unexpressed purpose. I am not certain even that all of these parties have been informed at the California Oregon Power Company not satisfied with rights procured under contract with the Federal Government has on February 19, 1919 an application with the State Engineer for a thousand additional second feet of water for power purposes.

"A year ago, it was the desire of officials of the California Oregon Power company to procure, lease and undertake the dyking of the Government marsh lands on the Upper Klamath Lake, but evidently the com-

pany decided it would not increase the popularity of the company to control all of this land. During the last several months the California Oregon company has been working thru third parties Mr. Rosborough stated to me that he had spent about six months at Washington working on various ramifications of this matter.

"Although we felt confident that the officials of the Reclamation Service would be reasonable in making changes in the exact provisions of the contract which was offered by the Government, we did not feel in position to count on this. Accordingly, it was necessary for us to include a few other amendments, which our engineer Donald M. Stevenson, with whom we had contracted after drawing up on his large amount of experience in dyking marsh lands, considered necessary.

"Seven thousand acres of land was much more acres than was desired and it was our intention to let friends take several thousand acres of the land and to use the machinery which we now have in intensively farming the rest.

"There is plenty of water in the flow of Upper Klamath Lake to irrigate all the country that can be reached, both below the lake and on its shores. But there is not enough to also supply an indefinite amount of electricity to San Francisco.
