HELENA, Mont., June 7.—Tuesday, June 17 has been designated as Good Roads day in Montana this year in a proclamation issued by Governor Sam V. Stewart. He urges the people of the state to set aside the day for highway improvement and he expresses the opinion that the residents of Montana fully realize the importance of good roads.

In years past it has been the custom of the citizens to turn out in large numbers clad in working clothes, and put in the day on the highways, tangible results being achieved.

MUST LABEL FISH TRAPS

NOME, Alaska, April 29.—(By mail)—Owners of fish traps, nets and fish wheels placed in Alaska waters are hereafter required to put an identification mark on their property according to a recent ruling approved by the secretary of commerce. The name of the individual, company or corporation owning or operating the appliance, together with a distinctive letter or number to identify each particular stake or net are required.

ALASKAN CITY IS A MONEY-MAKER

JUNEAU, May 29. (By Mail)—Juneau's total revenue for the past year amounted to \$91,462.96, according to a report of City Clerk A. B. Cole submitted to the city council. Expenditures were \$78,863.99 leaving the capital city on April 1 with a balance on the right side of the ledger of \$11,698.97.

Juneau's freedom from crime was illustrated by the fact that of the revenues of the city, only \$200 came from police fines.

OLD MILL STONES TO BE PRESERVED

COLVILLE, Wash., June 9.—The old millstones or burrs installed in a flour mill on the Little Pend Oreille river at Arden, six miles north of here, by Judge Yantis in 1858, have been shipped to Spokane, where they will be placed in a museum. It is said that some of the burrs came from Scotland and some from France. These stones ground the flour for all the country north of the Snake river for a time, it is declared.

O. M. Bell, who was instrumental in sending the stones to the Eastern Washington Historical society's museum at Spokane, also contributed an old Bible, which for many years was the constant companion of Angus McDonald, once governor of the Colville-Hudson Bay Post near Marcus.

BOZEMAN, Mont., June 9.—Student and former students of the Montana State college who gave their lives in the war are to be remembered with a bronze tablet to be placed in Montana hall, on the campus. It will bear the names of 15 students and former students of the institution who lost their lives in the military service.

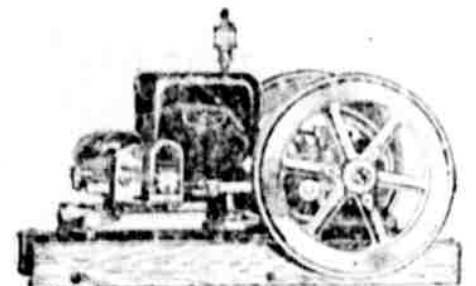
