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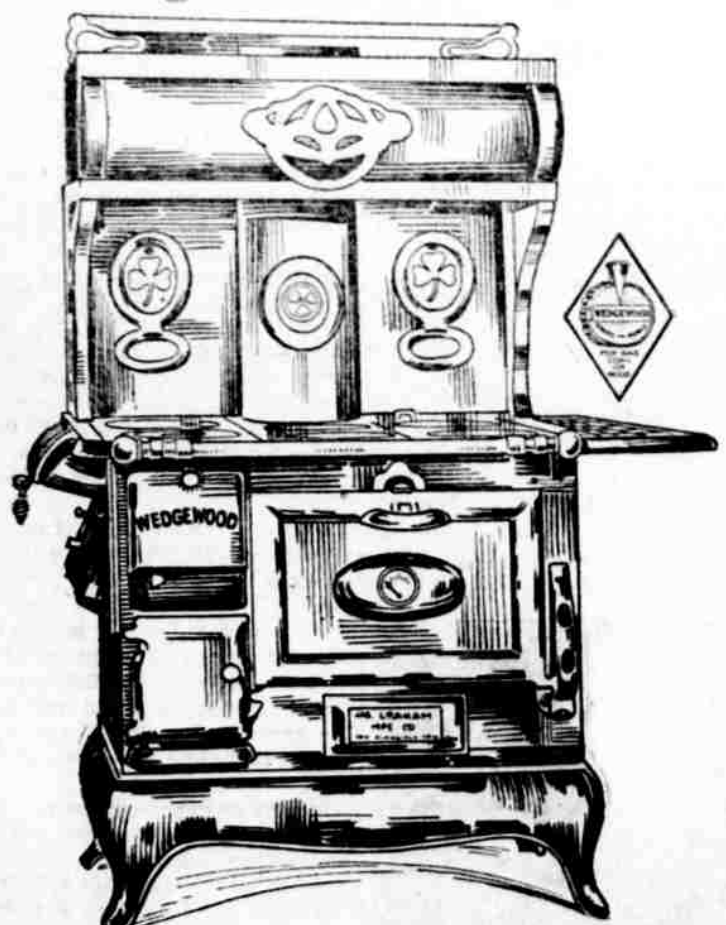
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SENATOR SAYS WAR TIME DRY ACT WILL STICK

WASHINGTON, June 11.—Senator Jones, of Washington, in an address here before the national convention of the Anti-Saloon League of America said he had been asked by many senators, who were opposed to prohibition that inasmuch as it was now written into the constitution as an extension of prohibition war, they would oppose any legislation for the repeal of the new war time beer and light wines in the war time prohibition act. He said he agreed therefore, there was no possibility of the modification of the act in that respect.

Many senators who voted against the prohibition amendment, Senator Jones said, also had assured him that they would support measures providing for the strictest enforcement of national prohibition.

Representative Fess of Ohio told the convention he believed it would be impossible to select a committee in either body of congress that would be "foolhardy" enough to make a favorable report on a measure providing for the repeal of the ban on beer and light wines in the war time prohibition act.

"The principle of self-determination rules congress nowadays," said Mr. Fess, "and it is not prepared to do the bidding of another."

STATE FAVORING RETURNING ROADS

PORTLAND, June 10.—Railroads should be returned to private management and ownership with more extended government regulations than existed prior to the war, according to 11 commercial organizations of the state, recently asked to vote on railroad ownership by the state chamber of Commerce. Of this number six believed there should be no government guarantee as to earnings, while the remainder believed there should be no government guarantee as to earnings, while the remainder believed there should be some guarantee of a minimum.

These 11 bodies represent about two-thirds of the commercial organizations answering the request for their opinions. Three other commercial clubs believed that the railroads should be returned to private ownership under no other government control than prevailed before the war. Two other clubs agreed that the government in returning the railways should compel a grouping of ownership into from 10 to 20 great systems.

These views represent the opinions of about 3,000 individual members of the constituent bodies.

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
