# YANKEE WAYS IN ITALY MUST FOLLOW HUNS

ROME. (Correspondence of the Associated Press.)—American influence in Italy must succeed German influence of pre-war days. American tools, machines and agricultural implements must replace the Teuton brands. American education must supercede Germanic education. The books from the shelves of libraries written in Italian mind with Germany's greatness and superiority and German catalogues written in Italian must make room for new books written in Italian of America's greatness and catalogues of American houses in Italian to preach American trade and commerce.

This was the statement of Dr. William Charles White, of the Rockefeller Tuberculosis Foundation commission serving with the American Red Cross. Dr. White has conducted an exhaustive investigation of the educational system of Italy with a view of introducing into the schools the American system of hygienic instruction.

"We have found in the libraries throughout Italy, hundreds of books telling of German methods and German systems. The ramifications which Germany had in Italy to capture Italy's trade were enormous. It brought her results for, until 1915, she had a greater commerce with Italy than any other nation.

"Knowledge of America where almost half a million Italians went annually before the war, of American methods and life are lacking in Italy while works on German education can be found in great abundance."

# UPHEAVAL OF POLITICS IN FRANCE SEEN

PARIS. (Correspondence of the Associated Press.)—The political upheaval in France, predicted as an aftermath of the war, appears to have begun. After the modification of factional lines in the Socialist party, the former extremist minority has become the majority.

The new Socialist majority, taking a far more extreme position than the element led by Albert Thomas and Marcel Sembat, former war ministers, does not yet openly pronounce for Bolshevist principles, though in the majority there is a still further extremist minority that demands immediate adherence to the doctrines of Lenin.

Several new political elements appear to be in the making and in some of them the soldier will, for the first time, make his influence felt.

Soldier candidates are likely to be numerous. There is already talk of Colonel Raynal, the hero of the fort of Vaux, as a candidate against the Socialist leader and Bolshevist sympathizer, Jean Longuet, grandson of Karl Marx. M. Calhous, whose candidacy for re-election in the Sarthe has been announced, may also have a name has been mentioned in this connection but probably without authority.

## STONE SAYS LABOR OPPOSED TO I. W. W.

DES MOINES, June 14.—"American railroad men will not tolerate the I. W. W. and similar fanatical organizations, as they believe that in this country one is either an American or an enemy and there is no room for the latter," Warren S. Stone, grand chief of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, said today. Stone is here attending the national meeting of the brotherhood.

## INTERNATIONAL LABOR MEETING IS PLANNED.

CHICAGO, June 14.—As a result of action taken here by a special committee of the Chicago Labor party, invitations to representatives of working groups in all civilized countries will be sent out soon, calling an international meeting in Chicago September 6 and 7. It was announced here today. Effort will be made to formulate plans to "bring order out of chaos in the present industrial and international situation."
