HAVE YOU USED THE NEW HENRY BUTTER CHURN?

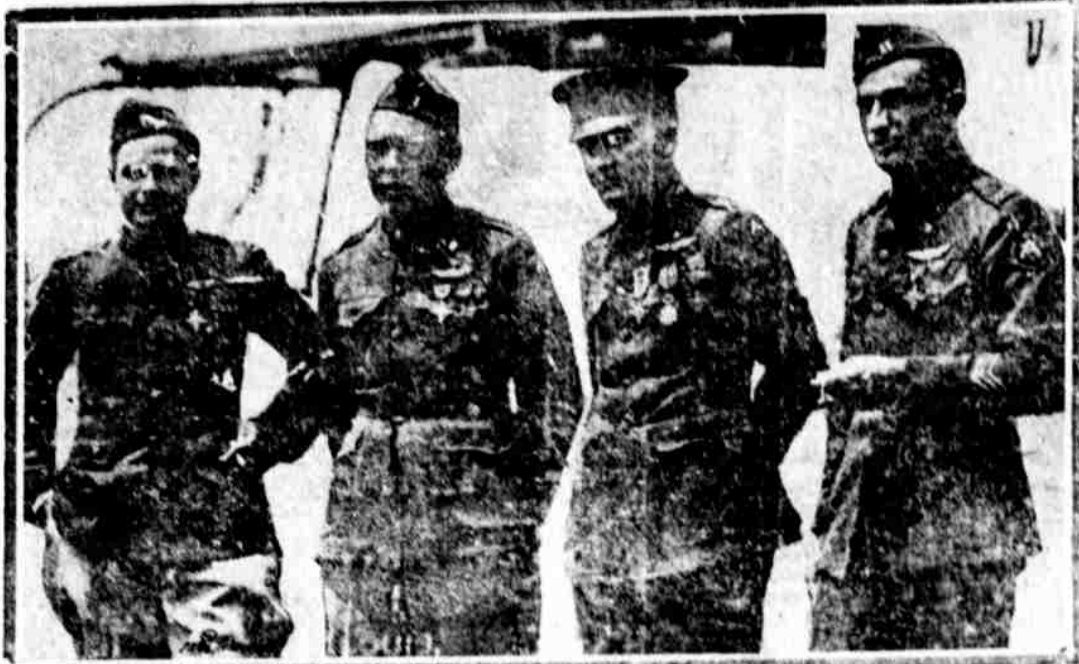

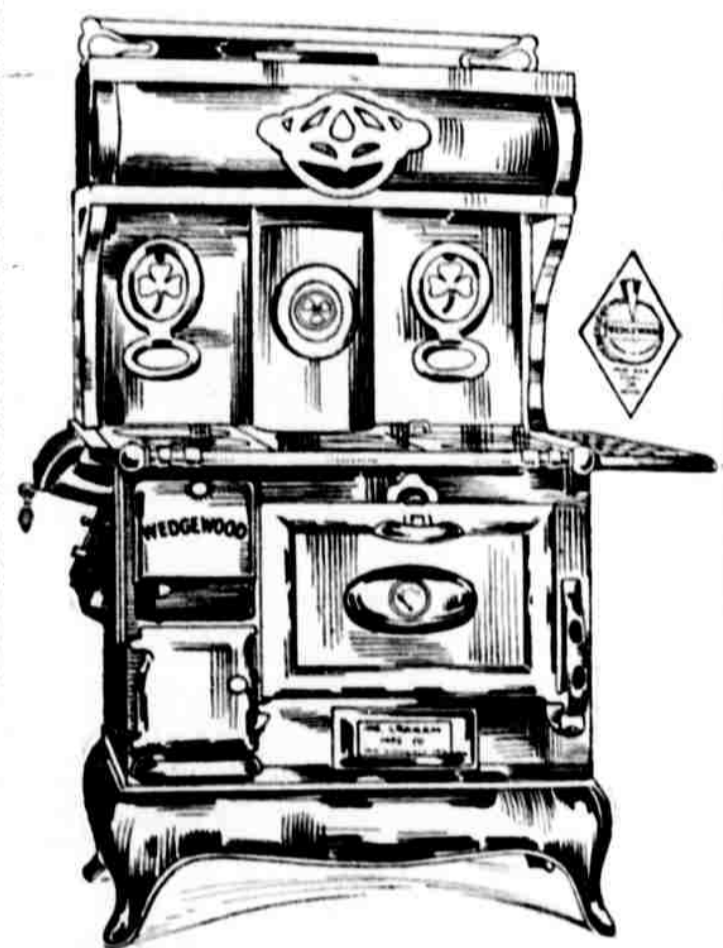

Federal Loans Increasing.

SPokane, Wash., June 14.—The federal land bank in Spokane placed more than \$1,000,000 in loans on farms during May, mostly on the coast. In the two years the bank has been organized loans totaling \$31,000,000 have been made, with a large number pending in the mails. Of the four states, Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Montana, comprise the twelfth district, Washington has the largest number of farm loan associations, totaling 119, with 3953 loans, aggregating \$25,000,000. The bank's guaranty fund has grown to more than \$11,000,000, and the amount the federal bank loans to the farmer is \$1,000,000. The bank's assets are \$1,000,000, and the farmer's liability for the notes he borrows is \$1,000,000.

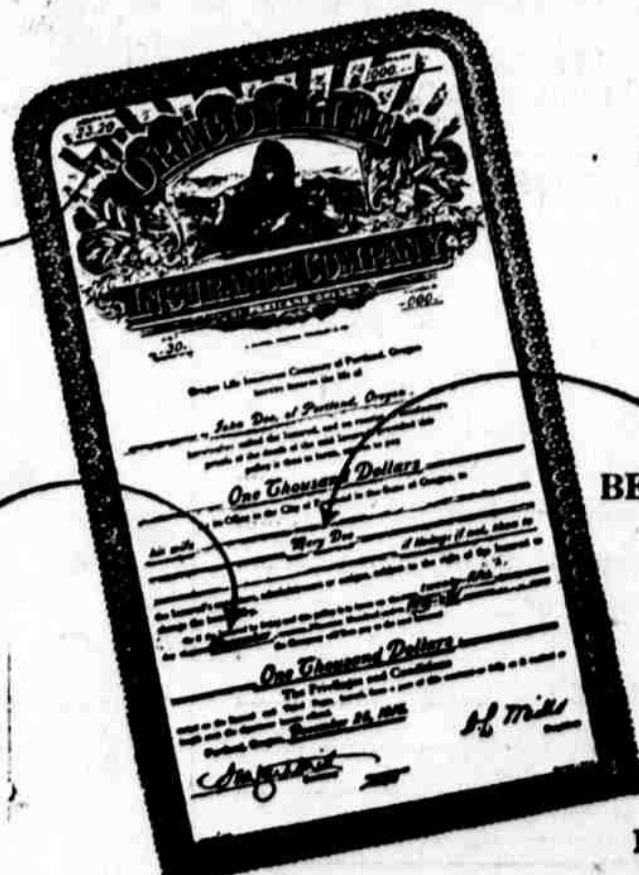
