NEW TANLAC
PLANT IS NOW
COMPLETEDMAGNIFICENT NEW LABORA-
TORY HAS DAILY CAPACITY OF
36,000 BOTTLESWhat is said to be one of the largest
pharmaceutical laboratories in
the United States has been completed
at Dayton, Ohio, for the manufacture

together enough money to add to its
value till we create a safe security
on which we can induce someone to
loan us the balance required. It is
only different in that it is just now
probably harder to borrow money for
building railroads than for any other
conceivable development that is
equally substantial."We have now about reached the
point where the \$300,000 which this
city voted, plus about half as much
more which I have personally con-
tributed, plus right of way, hundreds
of miles of surveys, four years of
hard work upon my part, your ter-
minal fund and other property will
all be used as security for a bond is-
sue to carry the work to Dairy and
beyond. The Oregon, California &
Eastern Railway company will au-
thorize a first mortgage bond issue
of \$1,000,000 to cover the cost of
its entire 400-mile system and these
bonds will be issued as further work
progresses to pay for same, provid-
ing I can find a market for them. I
have made some headway at this, the
closing of such negotiations for a suf-
ficient amount to complete the line
to Sprague river only depending upon
your people and myself delivering
the property an security we have
from the first agreed to furnish. The
city government has done its part
splendidly. A lot of your public spir-
ited citizens have done more than
theirs and I am putting through the
Dairy line at a cost of over \$40,000
in excess of the estimates when I took
the contract.""But the terminal fund is still
short and some of your citizens who
will be benefitted most have helped
not at all, or very little. They ought
not to thus lean upon their more
public spirited neighbors and myself
who have tugged and lifted with all
our strength and resources all
through these hard war years. They
have a great prize at stake, just as
those of us who have done more than
our share. They will have reason to
greatly regret it if they do not come
forward now and help sustain the
reputation of Klamath Falls for al-
ways going over the top.""I am advised that some of these
people offer as an excuse that this
road will be built anyway, because
the Hill interests or the Southern
Pacific or some other railway is be-
hind it.""As to its being built anyway: Yes,
this is possible, because some of us
are so determined that it shall not
fail that we may even struggle
through in some way without their
help. But as to any other railway or
railway interests having even a re-
mote connection with it in any shape
or form, let me again say, as I have
often said before, there is absolutely
nothing in it. The negotiations and
arrangements for capital have from
the beginning been as they are now
with men entirely outside of any
railway interest, otherwise it would
have been impossible to get any mon-
ey and the case would be hopeless.
No railway in American can spendany money for railway construction.
None of them is even able to keep up
their normal standard of repairs and
equipment, else why call upon the
government, which in the end means
all the balance of us, to put up bil-
lions for their accumulating de-
