# REBUILDING OF TOWNS MAY BE STARTED SOON

ATLANTIC CITY, June 20.—Special reconstruction towns may be established by the government in the near future, whose soldiers suffering from tuberculosis can regain their health and at the same time work at light trades to fit themselves for a full return to industrial life, said Colonel Estes Nichols, Commandant of the United States Army General Hospital No. 16 at New Haven, Conn., in an address at the annual meeting of the National Tuberculosis Association today.

This is being considered, he says, as a part of Uncle Sam's plan for Vocational re-education which, since the armistice has for its purpose the fitting of men disabled by the war for new positions in civil life.

The idea of special communities for these men and their families has been advanced by Captain F. A. Wagon of the United States Army General Hospital No. 16 and would be for the purpose of leading the ex-soldiers to new and better living conditions and full mental recuperation.

These towns, said Colonel Nichols, might be located upon lands in the national forests. This would permit of the setting up of activities and healthful work during the day for the patients and also an opportunity for them to retain permanent control of land holdings if so they were desired.

No matter where these towns were located proper medical supervision would be necessary, he said, but, whereas, medical treatment has first place in sanatorium care of sufferers from tuberculosis, productive industry would take precedence in the proposed reconstruction towns. These communities would require financial assistance at first but might eventually become self-supporting.

Surgeon H. J. Lloyd, of the United

States public health service said the building of the Panama Canal was but a day's work in comparison to the task of eradicating tuberculosis.

"The tuberculosis problem, when reduced to its lowest terms," he said, "means the germ of tuberculosis on the one hand, and the newborn babe on the other. Inasmuch as no baby is ever born with tuberculosis, if the two could be kept apart there would not be any tuberculosis problem."

Dr. Lloyd emphasized the need of a division of tuberculosis in the United States public health service. This, he said, would permit of co-operative correlation of the activities of all bodies and departments of the government engaged in tuberculosis work.

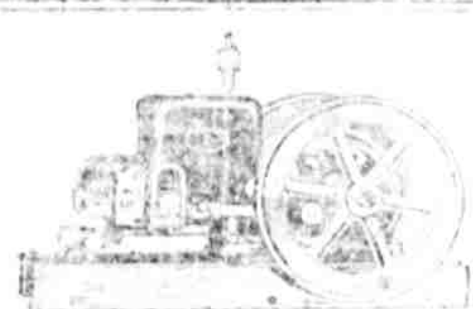

# WATER

Just a few years ago the City of Klamath Falls was "Up against it." Perhaps there wasn't one person in five hundred knew it, but, nevertheless, it was a fact.

The situation was critical, the future of the City hung in the balance. Few realized, busy in their everyday affairs, that the Queen City of Southern Oregon, standing as she does on the banks of a great river and touching with her boundaries two great lakes, was famished for water.

There was "Water, water everywhere, but not a drop to drink;" it was starvation in a land of plenty, for the water of these big lakes and in the river was tulle soaked and germ contained.

The only available supply was being pumped from an open spring into distributing reservoirs, but the quality was questioned and the supply inadequate.

Something had to be done; something was done! And today the City of Klamath Falls is possessed of an abundant supply of the purest artesian water in the world.

Three 12-inch wells were drilled through hard rock, one to a depth of 78 feet, one to 80 feet and one to 160 feet, from which pure, cold, clear water gushed. These wells were cased, capped and sealed, and it is from these rock covered strata that the water used in the City today is being pumped—water free from contamination of any kind, for it does not see the light of day until it pours into the reservoir, and then only until it again runs away into the mains to serve you at the faucet.
