#### BACK FROM VANCOUVER

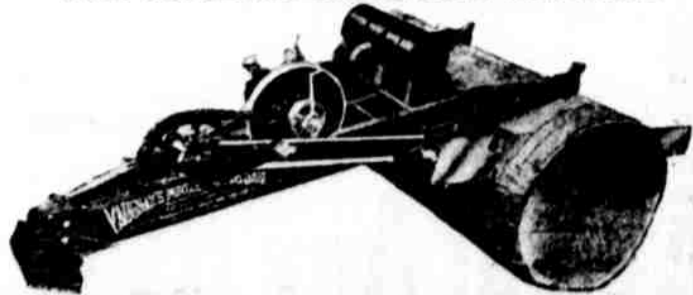
