

PRINCE OF WALES COMES THIS FALL

WASHINGTON, June 21.—The Prince of Wales will be the first of the distinguished foreign guests who will return in Washington the visits of President and Mrs. Wilson to European capitals.

Informal advices have communicated to the state department by the British embassy that the prince will arrive about August 12, following his official visit to Canada, and will spend at least four days in Washington, two days in New York and a week in the Middle West.

No definite program has been prepared, but it is known that Chicago, St. Louis, Akron and Memphis are among the cities the prince desires to visit. He is keenly interested in the irrigation of arid lands and hoped to see the American system in operation, but this will be impossible unless his visit can be extended beyond August 25, the date tentatively set for his departure.

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GASOLINE WAR ON IN EUGENE

EUGENE, June 21.—A gasoline war started here this week when the announcement was made by the Standard Oil company that the price of the fluid would advance one cent. Dealers are now charging two cents less than they were on the day following the rise. An understanding has existed among the Eugene garage men that they should obtain a profit of four cents on each gallon of gasoline sold. One garage refused to raise the price to 27 cents, which would have allowed the various firms the four cent profit. Yesterday every other garage in the city reduced the price to 25 cents.
