RESOLUTION.

The City Engineer pursuant to resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having on the 5th day of May 1919, filed plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of improving High Streets from 8th Street westerly to 1st Street, including intersections, and 1st, 2nd, 4th, 5th, 6th, and 7th Streets from High Street southerly to Pine Street, including intersections, and the Council having taken the same under advisement and finding the plans, specifications and estimates to be satisfactory.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, That the plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of High Street from 8th Street westerly to 1st Street, including intersections, and 1st, 2nd, 4th, 5th, 6th, and 7th Streets from High Street southerly to Pine Street, including intersections be, and the same are hereby approved and.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of High Street and 1st, 2nd, 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th Streets in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates; said improvement to consist of paving said portions of said streets with oil macadam pavement at an estimated cost, including cement side walks, concrete curbing and grading, of \$53,797.00; or concrete pavement at an estimated cost, including cement side walks, concrete curbing and grading, of \$69,151.00; or bitulithic pavement at an estimated cost, including cement side walks, concrete curbing and grading, of \$66,247.00; said improvement in either event to include grading, rolling, curbing and concrete side walks 4 feet wide on both sides of said streets and.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, By the Common Council that the property hereinafter described be, and hereby is, declared to be benefited by said improvement: Lots 1, 2, 3, and 4, Block 42; and southerly 1/2 of Block 41, Nichols Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; Lots 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 of Block 11;

Lots 1, 2, 7, and 8 of Block 4, original town of Klamath Falls, Oregon; The southerly 220 feet of Block 51; The southerly 250 feet of the premises occupied by the Klamath County High School, said property lying between High, 5th, 6th and Washington, formerly Canal Street; Lots 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10, of Block 50;

ASKS WHEAT BONUS TO AVERT TIE-UP



Julius H. Barnes, wheat director of the United States, gave Washington an outline for a wheat bonus to be added to the government's guaranteed price of \$2.26 per bushel and which is aimed to avert a tie-up of railroads and elevators in handling the great crop now being harvested. The plan asks that 1 to 2 cents per bushel be paid farmers for every month the wheat is held in their own granaries. It is estimated that one billion cars will otherwise be necessary in trying to handle the crop as farmers rush their grain to the market, knowing the price will not go higher under the guarantee law.
