BOOTLEGGERS AT MEDFORD VERY BUSY

MEDFORD, June 27.—Efforts to stock up with liquor before July 1 have led to such a flood of whiskey in Jackson county that Sheriff Terrell has placed a special squad of deputies in the Siskiyou to apprehend the violators.

Sunday six men and one woman were arrested, and after a trial Monday, fined \$15 each and costs. Oscar Peterson of this city, found in an intoxicated condition, was fined \$50 and given a 30-day jail sentence.

Early last week a rumor passed around that the way was clear to Hornbrook and would be clear until war-time prohibition became effective. Where the rumor came from is not known, but it led to a veritable hegin of bootleggers, it being estimated that 500 liquor cars passed into Oregon in five days over the Siskiyou road alone. It is believed the new regulations on the part of county officials will render the running of the blockade hereafter extremely dangerous.
