The case of assault and battery against Minnie Huff was set for July 12th.

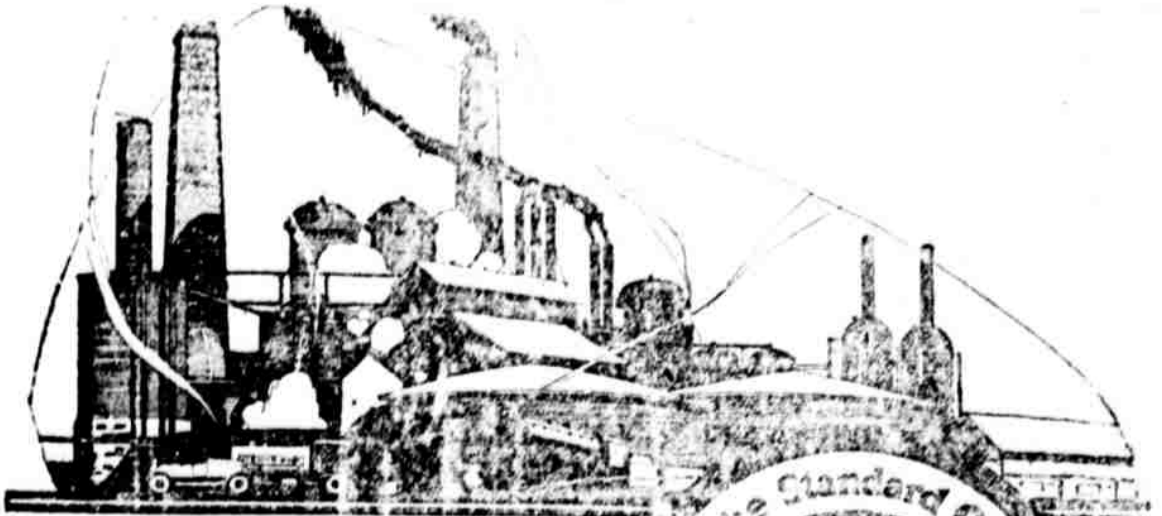
### CAMPERS WILL BE SORRY WHEN THEY HEAR THE NEWS
