

THEATRE WILL UPLIFT DRAMA

DISTINGUISHED PERSONS FORM THEATRE ARTS ALLIANCE TO PERFORM MAMMOTH GREEK AMPHITHEATRE IN HOLLYWOOD

LOS ANGELES, Calif., July 10.—Southern California men and women, prominent in art, music and literature, have launched a movement known as the Theatre Arts Alliance, for the purpose of erecting a mammoth amphitheatre and other buildings for the advancement of art and drama, in the hills surrounding Hollywood near here.

The founders of the Theatre Arts Alliance announce that it is a "non-profit, altruistic corporation" which is "inspired by the success of production of 'Julius Caesar' in Beach Canyon and 'The Light of Asia' at Krotova, and is to be the synthesis of literature, music, acting, dancing, architecture, sculpture, painting, engineering, lighting, costuming and stage of all kinds."

A site comprising 54 acres in the heart of the Hollywood hills has been acquired and construction of the temple of art and the theatres will be

gin within 90 days, it is asserted. The site comprises a valley, partly wooded and forming a natural bowl in the hills. It is situated on El Camino Road (the King's Highway).

"To make of Southern California the Oberammergau of America; a recognized pilgrim place of the world; the Mecca of the most of the most distinguished personages in drama, music and the allied arts; a recognized art center of the world," is the object of the alliance, according to its promoters.
