An Ordinance Civing and Granting to the Klamath Heating Company, a Franchise and Right to Freet, Maintain, Use and Remove, Pipes Steam Mains, Cables, Ducts, Appliances and Apparatus for Conducting and Using Steam and Hot Water in, Under and Upon Any and all Street, Alleys, Roads and Ways in the City of Klamath Falls, in the County of Klamath, State of Oregon, Within the Limits and Boundaries of Said City as Said City Now Is, or Hereafter May Be Bounded and Constituted, and have Its Limits, and to Supply Heat and Hot Water to the People and Inhabitante of the City of Klamath Falls, and to Charge and Col-lect Tolls therefor,

The City of Klamath Falls ordains es Follows: Section 1—T' at the Klamath

Heating Company, a corporation of Oregon, for and during the term hereinafter provided, be, and hereby is granted subject to the considerations and conditions in this ordinance contained, a franchise and right, to erect. maintain, use and remove, pines, steam mains, cables, ducts, appliances and apparatus for providing and using steam and hot water in under, upon and over any and all streets, alleys, rends and ways of, or in said city, within the limits and boundaries of said city, as the same is now or hereafter may be bounded. Phone constituted and have it limits, both 12-3t for the purpose of furnishing and supplying heat and hot water for any and all nurposes to the people and inhabitants of the said city, coming within the boundaries of said plant.
