H. Orem, is spending a week with his son, at his ranch on the Merrill road.

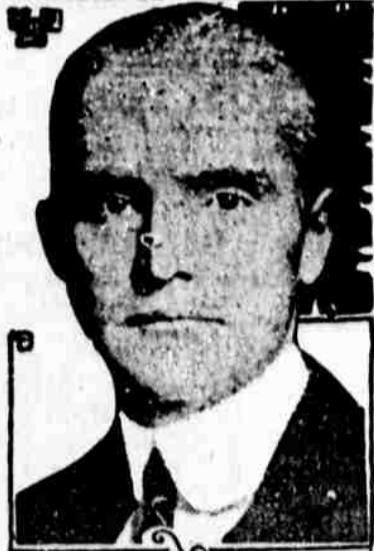
Miss Edna Wells, county school superintendent, is spending a few days with relatives in Ashland and Medford.
