EL PASO, Texas, July 19 - Like the chain of forts built in the days of the Indians to guard the Staked Planes and the Southwest from raids by marauding bands of savages, the United States Army is building permanent outposts along the Mexican border to prevent incursions by armed bands of Mexican bandits across the border. These will extend from the Pacific to the mouth of the Rio. Grande at Brownsville, Tex., and will be garrisoned by detachments of infantry and cavalry from the Southern department.

Construction work is in progress on these permanent outposts in the Il Paso district, including the Big Read sub-district of Texas and the rub-district of New Mexico. In the Big bend, where many Mexican raids have occurred, these outposts are being built like the blockhouses of frontier days with frenches surconding the low adobe and concrete buildings, built in the form of a quad rangle to give the best possible of the eve protection. At Puly . Baid at Redford, Clen Springs and Vaido Citydra these outposts are being conteing built at Marfo, Texas, 60 miles from the border, to serve as headquarters for the outposts.
