After enduring untold suffering in German jails, Mrs. Margaret Gentz Fuhrman, daughter of a Chicago publisher, is back home. When the war began she was in Germany, the wife of a German artist named Fuhrman. Their opposing views led her to apply for a divorce, as she could not leave Germany while still a subject. Her suit was forgotten in the hurry of wartime and she began doing war work. She was appointed to a post censoring British mail at a camp near Berlin and time and again she aided prisoners to escape. With a Yank and a Tommy she herself escaped and got as far as Hamburg. She was in the vilest of prisons for more than a year and when she got out weighed only 75 pounds.

FAMOUS GENERAL IS IN COMMAND OF BORDER LAND

EL PASO, Tex., July 22. The crossing of American troops into Mexico, at Juarez June 5 last brought prominence before the American public, Brig. Gen. James B. Erwin, commander of the border district, who gave the order for the crossing. His action later was sustained by high military authority. For a long time he had been a figure of considerable prominence in army affairs and was commander of two of the divisions that helped defeat the German army.

General Erwin's expression most frequently is a smiling one and his men declare he is one of that tribe of "smiling fighters" whom it is the part of discretion not to arouse.

From his graduation from the United States Military academy in 1880 until he assumed command of the seventh cavalry on the Mexican border in 1914 there was little in his career to attract wide interest in civilian circles. In the army, however, his work was well and widely known and his promotions were rapid. He held various posts usually with cavalry regiments but including details in the inspector general's and adjutant general's department. In 1883 he was an honor graduate of the infantry and cavalry school.

His arrival on the border in 1916 afforded Gen. Erwin his first opportunity. He was second in command under Col. George Dodd, of border fame, who led the cavalry brigade of General Pershing's punitive expedition command. Colonel Dodd, recommending him for an appointment as a brigadier general, wrote, "For gallantry, coolness and marked activity in the fight with Villars command at Guerrero, Mexico, March 20, 1916, and for most commendable energy displayed as second in command on the long and difficult marches I recommend, etc." and added in closing, "favorable consideration of this recommendation is strongly urged."

When the United States recognized that a state of war existed with Germany, the then colonel early was given a brigadier general's commission. He remained with the Eighty-second division for a few months, then organized the Sixth division, he went overseas in command of this division, but after signing of the armistice was transferred to command the Ninety-Second division, with which he returned to the United States. Last March he assumed command of the border district.

General Erwin is known to many officers, particularly of the old army school, as "Jimmy", while the men he commands have dubbed him affectionately "the best 'old man' on earth." He is to be retired next year. General Erwin is a native of Georgia.

MINISTER SAYS PRICES TO RISE

England Poor, Yet She Lives Like a Millionaire Declares British Minister of Reconstruction

LONDON, July 22.—Prophecy that the price of food next winter will "climb to a level never dreamed of," was uttered by Sir Auckland Geddes, the British Minister of Reconstruction, in an address at Crewe recently.

A member of the audience shouted, "more wages." Sir Auckland replied that there would be no money to pay wages because it would have to go overseas to pay for food.

The Minister warned the public that it was squandering its money in a colossal way on things that did not matter.

"You cannot live like millionaires," he said, "if you are as poor as a church mouse. This nation is now poor. It is living as if it were wealthy."

More beer was being brewed in Great Britain yet people complain of a shortage. This he attributed to a doubling of the amount of beer consumed because, since the war, there was more time to drink it in and more money to pay for it.

By sending overseas for beer, silk for stockings and feathers for hats, Sir Auckland said, the people were increasing Britain's debt for things that did not matter. "What you ought to get are food and raw material," he declared.

Sir Auckland denounced the limitation of output as, "stark, staring lunacy." The mill owners, he said, limited output to obtain higher prices and the operators limited it to make work for more people.

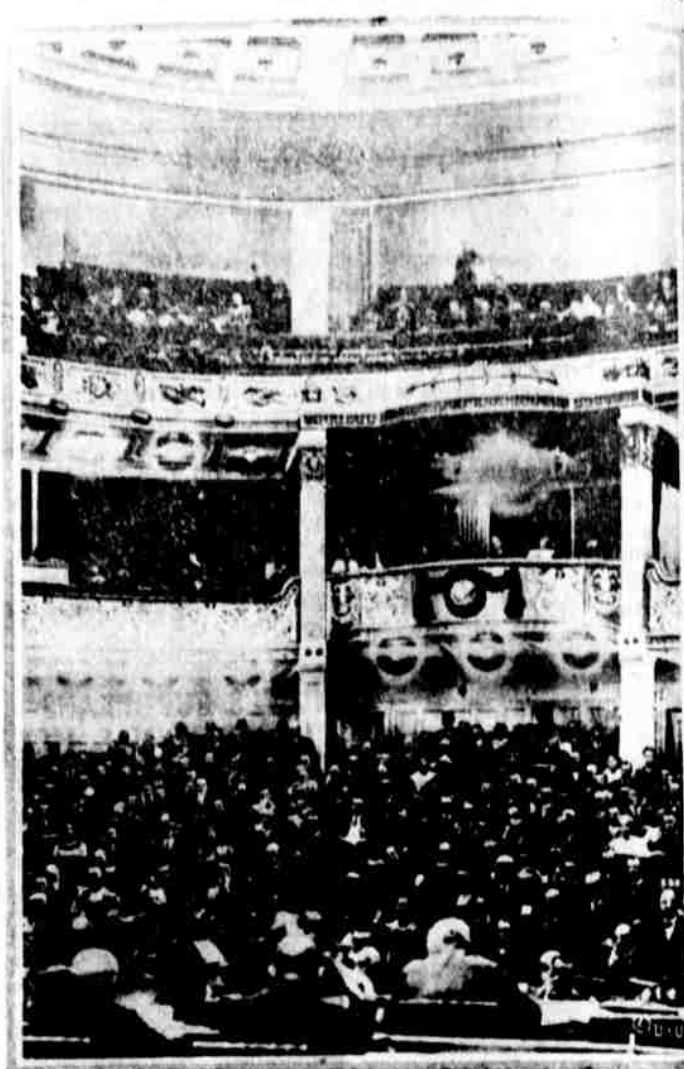
SHOEMAKER HERE ON ANNUAL VISIT

Game Warden Comes to Look Into Local Conditions and Investigate Complaints About Elk Depredations

State Game Warden, Carl B. Shoemaker arrived here last night on his annual visit to this county, coming earlier than usual on account of the complaints that have been made about the elk around Fort Klamath. Several of the ranchers in that part of the county are getting tired of loss, they are sustaining by the elk breaking into pastures and have entered a vigorous protest with Deputy Game Warden Stout, who has passed it on to his superiors. Mr. Shoemaker will make a thorough investigation of the matter and present the whole question at the next meeting of the State Fish and Game Commission. The flurry of sentiment that brought several herds of elk to this state has passed and there is a feeling that if any other state is anxious to get them Oregon would shed no tears over their departure. This is especially true of the ranchers who have sustained considerable loss as a result of the visits paid them by this game.

The conditions thruout the state are very satisfactory, according to a statement by Mr. Shoemaker. Due to the dry season, the number of birds has greatly increased and this has kept the Warden busy investigating complaints from orchardists.
