The audience, too, surprised him. It was of the thoughtful kind, and more fashionably gowned than before the war.

In a one-time music hall where a popular actress was being featured and where the salutes from the stage formerly were greeted with uproarious laughter, there was now nothing more apparent than good-humored tolerance.

"I suppose it is the war," he said.

"For it is certain the Londoner is taking his pleasure much more seriously than when I was last there."


