

BEND TO HAVE NEW HOSPITAL

Sisters of St. Joseph to Build First of Three-unit Institution at Cost of \$65,000

BEND, Or., July 23.—Contracts will be drawn up tomorrow between the Sisters of St. Joseph, the mother house of which order is situated in Tipton, Indiana, and Lee A. Thomas for the preparation of plans for a Sisters' hospital to be located on the hospital site between Oregon and Franklin streets, familiarly known as the water power site.

Mother Xavier, representing the mother house, has been in Bend for several weeks awaiting the return of Father Luke Sheehan in order to discuss plans with him before a formal announcement was made. Mother

Xavier is accompanied by Sister Agatha, who will assist in the plans for construction.

To Use Unit Plan.

According to the mother superior, the hospital will be erected in units, the first to be one of three units which will consist of two pavilions and administration unit. One pavilion will be erected at once, the cost of which, together with fixing up grounds, will total about \$35,000. The structure will be more than 2 stories, including a sub-basement. It will face approximately north and will be on the crest of the high ground. It is planned that the first unit will have about 30 private rooms with wards to make a total of about 50 beds. In addition, it will contain operating rooms, nurse quarters, surgeons' private suites, laundry, heating plant and such other rooms as accompany hospitals of the type erected by these Sisters. The building will be equipped with elevators, and steam heat. Interior finish will be the latest that is now put in the largest hospitals in the country.

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MARSHFIELD WANTS NEW HOSPITAL

MARSHFIELD, Or., July 23.—Indicating that there are plans to operate the big mill of the C. A. Smith company which has been idle since March, a resolution was last night presented to the city council by John C. Kendall, attorney, and was immediately adopted by the council without comment.

The resolution points out the importance of the operation of the big mill, because of its connection with the power service of the city and urges that the court act to make possible its operation. The move is taken as corroboration of the announcement made that C. A. Smith or those representing him, are dealing for a right to operate the big plant. A hearing on this takes place at Portland next Monday.

It is rumored a year lease on the property has been asked.


