

1,584,000 gallons of Water is being pumped every twenty-four hours into the reservoirs supplying the twenty two miles of distributing pipes which carry water to 1,013 customers in the City of Klamath Falls. This means that did each of these users receive a pro rata of water served, every service would be entitled to 1,554 gallons a day, or, based on a population of 5,000, about 316 gallons to each man, woman or child, every day. Such an amount is far in excess of all requirements, so that fi any one or more users are being deprived of ample water for ALL PUR-
