## INSTITUTIONS TO GET BUFFALO

Secretary of Agriculture Will Give  
Buffalo to Municipalities From  
Surplus in Herds in Different  
Parts of Country.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8.—Provision is made in the current agricultural appropriation act for the Secretary of Agriculture to give buffalo to municipalities and public institutions from any surplus which may exist in the herds now under control of the Department of Agriculture. In order to aid in the propagation of the species the bill provides that animals may be lent to or exchanged with other owners of American bison. No provision is made to give them to individuals, and only one may be given to each municipality or public institution. This provision is made because of the surplus of bulls in some of the Department of Agriculture's buffalo herds, particularly the one in the Wichita National Forest and Game Preserve, in Oklahoma, and because the department is nearing the realization of the first stage in the preservation of the species—the acquisition of at least 1,000 head of buffalo by the Government.

There are approximately 7,000 buffalo in North America. Canada has something over 3,500, and the total number in the United States is more than 3,000. This is about seven times the number in the United States in 1889, when the first buffalo census was taken. Individuals in the United States own approximately 2,000 of the total number in this country. There are eight Government herds, six of which are under the control of the Department of Agriculture. The largest herd in this country is in charge of the Interior Department and is located in the Yellowstone National Park, where there are about 450 bison. The Smithsonian Institution now has a herd of 18 at the National Zoological Park, Washington, D. C.

The first herd of buffalo under the Department of Agriculture was established in 1906 on the Wichita National Forest and Game Preserve. The original herd consisted of 15 animals, the gift of the New York Zoological Society, and this has now increased to more than 100 animals without any outside additions. Two herds have been established in the past year, one in Sully's Hill Park, North Dakota, the other in the Pisgah National Game Preserve, North Carolina. The other herds supervised by the Department of Agriculture are located in the Montana National Bison range; the Niobrara Reservation, Nebraska; and the Wind Cave Game Preserve, South Dakota. The plan of the department is to establish at least ten herds, widely distributed, in order to prevent the spread of any contagious disease, should it become uncontrollable in any of the herds.

In addition to the boxing carnival, John Kuntz, proprietor of the Golden West Amusement co., on the Elks fun zone at Eighth and Main, to stage an athletic tournament open to all comers for the three days of the convention, so anyone with athletic ability in the various lines, will be given an opportunity to test themselves.

The interest the Elks have taken, in arrangement of athletic sports have proved popular.

The advance sale predicts a banner house, as the call for ring side seats has surpassed the sale of any previous boxing contest ever held in Klamath.

So keen is the interest that 26 rounds of boxing will be staged on Friday night at the Opera House to 've the fans who cannot see Thursday's matches, a chance to see some

high-class boxing. Dannie O'Brien, the Portland welter-weight, will not box Thursday night, as announced in last night's Herald, but will go six rounds on Friday evening with Bobbie Waugh in the feature event. The main event of ten rounds will be between Bobbie Allen and Toby Miller at 145 pounds. Both are husky, hard-hitting chaps who have fine records in the boxing game.
