WILL STRIVE TO SELL PRODUCTS

San Francisco Business Men May Go to Buenos Aires to Open Up New Field for Market for California Products.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 11.—To stimulate sale of California products in Argentina and other South American countries, a commission of business men may be sent in the near future from this state to Buenos Aires, according to plans being formulated by the Latin-American committee of the San Francisco Chamber of Commerce.

This campaign to introduce California goods in South America is to be started thru the newspapers of the various countries. Information is being compiled concerning the advantages in shipping goods direct from San Francisco to Buenos Aires and it is not unlikely the Federal Shipping board will be asked to establish a direct line between the two cities, providing the necessary amount of export business can be created.

The exporting of California products to Brazil and Argentina at the present time is a very small item, according to V. H. Kinckney, a prominent member of this committee. During the past five years, he said, only \$116,946 worth of canned fruits, one of California's leading products, was shipped to Argentina. He accounts lack of trade along this line to the duty, which on these goods amounts to twice the original price.

"We must first make the people of Argentina understand that canned fruits and other California products are not luxuries," said Mr. Kinckney. "Just now, many articles which are considered by the people of this country as staple commodities are classified under the tariff provisions of the Latin-American countries together with confections and perfumes. This condition, makes prices in those countries to the great mass of people practically prohibitive."

During last year, South America sent \$512,896,920 worth of goods into this country, government statistics indicate. More than 94 percent of all this product came free from tariff, according to Mr. Kinckney. The committee of which he is a member is going to attempt to show the people of South America it is to their advantage to lower tariff rates affecting goods sent from this country, that more evenly balanced trade conditions can exist.
