NOTICE INVITING PROPOSALS.

Pursuant to ordinance and order of the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, notice is hereby given that proposals will be received by said common council for making the improvement designed for the improvement of Seventh street from Washington street north to Prospect street; Prospect street from Seventh street northwesterly to Eighth street and Jefferson street from Seventh street easterly to eighth street, including intersections.

Said proposed improvement to be made in accordance with the plans and specifications of the City Engineer, and approved by the said Common Council, and in accordance with Ordinance No. 468 adopted on the 4th day of August 1919, and by the mayor approved on the 5th day of August 1919.

Said plans and estimates and specifications being on file with the City Engineer.

The proposed improvement will be let in one contract, and the time in which the same is to be completed is fixed by said ordinance for Nov. 1st, 1919.

Bids must be filed with the Police Judge for submission to the Council, at his office in the city hall not later than 8 o'clock p. m. of the 18th day of August 1919, at which time and place proposals will be opened and considered. Each proposal must be accompanied by a certified check on some responsible bank to the amount of 5 per cent of the aggregate amount of the proposal, to be forfeited by the successful bidder upon failure to enter into contract and bond for the faithful completion of the improvement in accordance with the plans and specifications. The City of Klamath Falls reserving the right to reject any and all proposals for making said improvement.

The award to the successful bidder for making the proposed improvement is hereby made contingent upon the sale of the bonds authorized to provide funds for making said improvement.

BIG CROP OF MELONS SOLD IN ARIZONA

PHOENIX, Ariz., Aug. 13.—What is said to be a record crop of water-melons has just been sold here by Carl S. Rousseau, who lives north of this city. Rousseau obtained 45 tons of melons from one acre of land. He sold them for prices ranging from \$20 to \$40 a ton. One truckload weighing 6,000 pounds was composed of melons averaging 43 pounds weight each. Another slightly smaller truckload averaged 45 pounds per melon.

EASIER FOR ALIENS TO BECOME CITIZENS

Red tape, for foreigners wishing to become citizens of the United States, has been cast aside in the case of honorably discharged aliens, who have seen service in the army or navy of the United States, according to C. R. DeLap, Clerk of the Circuit Court.

Under the old naturalization law a foreigner must have first filed a declaration, waited two years, and then before two witnesses swear that he has been a resident of the United States for five years and of the state for at least one year. This petition was then posted for 90 days before the applicant was granted full citizenship. Under the new law passed this June, it is only necessary to declare his intention and have the naturalization examiner sign the papers to become a citizen of the United States.

The first two foreigners to take advantage of this new relief at Klamath Falls are Antonio Toffo Lette and Dimitros Rappanastasin, who filed their petition with the clerk of the Circuit court this afternoon. As the naturalization examiner has not yet reached here they will have to wait a few days for the signing of their papers.
