WASHINGTON, Aug. 15.—Attorney General Palmer told the Senate Agriculture committee he intended to prosecute all dealers in necessities, who are selling above the price-fixing committees in cities.

The food control act profiteering sections have been extended to clothing and other necessities. McNary, of Oregon, said he believed the bill was now sufficient to reach any conceivable case. A resolution was introduced in the house asking the President what use had been made of the \$100,000,000 for the relief of the destitute Europeans.
