### SULPHUR ORDERS CAN BE FILLED

Those Who Desire Sulphur for Farms Can Get It by Placing Orders for the Amount They Need Immediately.

In accordance with statements made at the time of the auto tour regarding the grouping together of orders for sulphur, arrangements have been made for placing the orders at once, for delivery about October 1st. Those who expect to use sulphur on their alfalfa another year and wish to take advantage of the

car lot prices, which can be obtained by the grouping of orders, should get in touch with the county agricultural agent's office immediately. It is desired to place the order with the sulphur company within the next ten days.

The use of sulphur for increasing the yield of alfalfa has been so well demonstrated this past season that undoubtedly there will be much of it used this fall. One hundred pounds per acre is the amount recommended. Indications are that one application will last from three to four years. It is recommended that the sulphur be applied during the fall, winter or early spring. Considering the usual weather conditions, and also the rush of work in the spring, it would seem very desirable, under Klamath conditions,

to supply the sulphur this fall, and for that reason a special effort is being made to have the first shipment arrive about October 1st. Even if you do not care to have your supply come with the first shipment, you would do well to place your order at once, and avoid the possibility of waiting until the demand would be for less than a car load, and in that case lose the benefit of the car lot price.

### At the Theatres

Literally from the moment the play starts until the very last foot of the last reel the audience is kept in one continual condition of cachinnation, for there is not a moment when something surprising and unexpected does not happen, and all of the droll situations are cleverly build up one on top of the other, culminating in one grand finale of unrestrained mirth.

At times during the course of the comedy it certainly looks as though the authors were going to indulge in broad humor of the type so much in vogue with the "bed-room farces" which have lately provoked so much discussion on Broadway, but nothing of this kind happens in "All Wrong," which is from start to finish a per-

fectly clean and wholesome entertainment.
