STATE HEADS ARE IN CONFERENCE

Governors of Twenty States Open Conference at Salt Lake City Today to Discuss Leading Administrative Problems.

SALT LAKE CITY, Aug. 19.—Problems affecting state governments were to be thoroughly threshed out today at the opening business session of the annual Governors' Conference, which convened here last night. Chief executives from all Western states and many Eastern and mid-Western commonwealths were in attendance.

Questions to be discussed at today's session included the state budget system and the growth and consolidation of administrative boards of the different states. Entertainment features included bathing and dancing at the Saltair bathing resort on Great Salt Lake and an informal dinner tendered by Governor Simon Bamberger of Utah. More than twenty state executives were in attendance at the opening of the conference last night, at which addresses of welcome and responses were made, followed by an informal public reception. The business meetings are being held in the assembly room of the house of representatives at the state capitol.

Governors present today included those from Arizona, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Idaho, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Maryland, Minnesota, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Carolina, North Dakota, Oregon, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Washington, West Virginia and Wyoming.

Wednesday the Governors will take up "after the war problems," and "resume of remedial legislation enacted by legislatures in 1919," under which question will come education, labor and agriculture. The principal problem to be discussed on Thursday will be expansion of the national guard system as a basis for national defense. Entertainment features each day include a visit to the famous copper mines at Bingham, about 45 miles southwest of this city, and a trip to Ogden and Weber canyons. The Governors will leave Thursday evening, August 21st for a three-day tour of Yellowstone Park, returning to Salt Lake Monday morning, from here to return to their homes or to the Pacific Coast on pleasure trips.

WAR COSTS \$40,000,000

LONDON, Aug. 19.—Lloyd George told the House of Commons today that the war had cost \$40,000,000. He likewise said that the British government had accepted the policy of state purchase of mineral rights in coal. That there is at present an alarming adverse balance of trade was the declaration of the premier.

GERMANS HAVE TWO FLOTILLAS

Newly Organized Torpedo Boat Flotillas Constitute All of the Warships Left of the Once Powerful German Navy.

WITH THE AMERICAN FORCES IN GERMANY, Aug. 18.—The Germans have organized two flotillas of torpedo boats since the armistice and these constitute virtually all the warships left in active service in the German Navy, according to information received here.

One of these flotillas is described in Mithraschiff, a German naval periodical which has reached the American headquarters, as the Iron Torpedo Boat Flotilla. It consists of 12 torpedo boats which, the periodical says, have been engaged in maintaining order on the western coast of Germany.

Some of the vessels of the flotilla have been used on several occasions for police work in the port of Hamburg, doing duty guarding allied food shipments to the Czechoslovaks and similar work during periods of disorder. The flotilla has its headquarters at Wilhelmshaven. A landing corps of about 360 men is distributed among the twelve boats, each of which has a platoon of thirty commanded by a naval lieutenant. The clothing and arms of members of this landing corps are the same as in the infantry.

The other group of vessels called the Haff flotilla is supposed to be doing similar duty on the Baltic coast near the Russian boundary, with headquarters in Koenigsberg. The

boats are armed with machine guns, and in some cases with 3.7 centimeter guns as well. The flotilla was organized for operation in connection with the East Prussian Freiwilling corps and was until a few weeks ago subject to the commander of the northern army.
