Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, did, by Ordinance No. 475, duly adopted on the 11th day of August, 1919, and approved by the Mayor on the 19th day of August, 1919, declare the proportionate assessment upon each lot, part of lot, block and acreage property found to be benefited and liable for the cost of improving Lincoln street from Ninth street easterly to Eleventh street, including intersections, less the U. S. Irrigation canal and right of way appurtenant thereto.
