The plans, specifications and estimates above referred to embrace provide for the proposed improvement of said streets by grading same to the established grade from property line to property line on High Street from 6th to 8th Streets, and 6th, and 7th Streets and intersections between High and Pine Streets; and from property line to property line on High Street from 6th to 1st Streets, and 1st, 2nd, 4th, 5th, 6th, and 7th Streets from High to Pine Streets, and hard surfacing said pavement 25 feet wide on High Street from 6th to 8th Streets and 6th and 7th Streets from High to Pine Streets, and 20 feet wide on High Street from 6th to 1st Streets, and 1st, 2nd, 4th, 5th, from High Street to Pine Street, including concrete curbs, with either oil macadam, concrete or bituminous pavement, including cement sidewalks 4 feet wide on both sides of said streets. Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the city of Klamath Falls, Oregon, did, by ordinance No. 477 duly adopted on the 18th day of August 1919, and approved by the mayor on the 19th day of August 1919, declare the proportionate assessment upon each lot, part of lot, block and acreage property found to be benefited and liable for the cost of improving Eighth Street from High Street northerly to Prospect Street; Lincoln Street from Eighth Street easterly to Ninth Street; and Jefferson Street from Eighth Street easterly to Ninth Street, including intersections.
