"GRAND OLD MAN" TO ENTERTAIN DANIELS

HONOLULU, T. H. Aug. 22.—Prominent among those who will be active in the entertainment of Secretary of the Navy Daniels is Sanford B. Dole, Hawaii's "Grand old Man," who enjoys the distinction of being

the only American who has been president of a republic other than the United States.

Mr. Dole, the son of early American missionaries to Hawaii, was a leader in the movement which de-throned Queen Liliuokalani, last of the native rulers, in 1893, and was largely responsible for the annexa-

tion of Hawaii by the United States in 1898. In the five intervening years Mr. Dole was president of the republic of Hawaii. He was also the first governor of the territory of Hawaii.
