CORNERSTONE OF CHURCH IS LAID

Fitting Exercises Accompany the Laying of the Cornerstone of the Presbyterian Church—History of Church Is Given.

Fitting exercises accompanied the laying of the cornerstone of the Presbyterian Church at the corner of Sixth and Pine Streets last night, before an audience of 300 or more townspeople.

Rev. C. F. Trimble opened the ceremonies with a prayer. The history of the church, since its early days, down to the present day, was read by Rev. E. P. Lawrence, present pastor of the church.

Following the exercises the cornerstone was laid. A copy of the "History of the Church" was placed under the cornerstone. Extracts from the history follow:

The First Presbyterian Church of Linkville (now Klamath Falls), Oregon, was organized February 27, 1884, with Rev. Robert McLean as stated supply. Wm. A. Wright as clerk, and the following charter members:

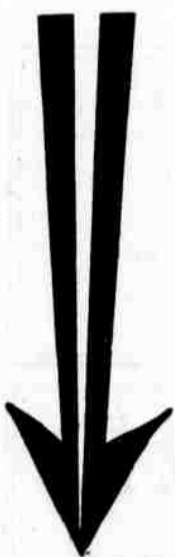
