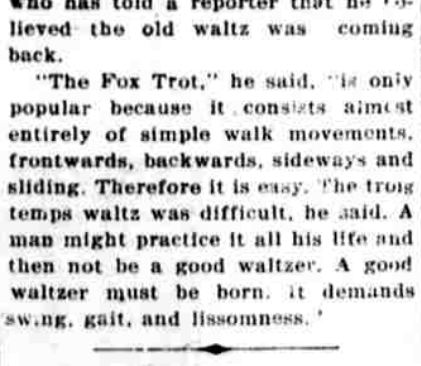
SAYS "JAZZ" DOOMED

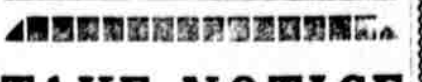
