### ITALIANS PLAY SOCCER WITH THERMOMETER AT 90

ROME, Sept. 6.—With the thermometer registering 90 degrees in the shade, soccer football, a winter sport in most countries has become the summer game of Italy. The opening game of the season was played here recently under a blazing sun, the players being unmindful of the heat. During the week, teams from elementary and high schools of Rome play wherever there is a vacant spot.

### NERVOUS CASES CURED IN AIR

Doctors Say Flying Will Provide Great Boon for Treatment of All Nervous Cases—Sensations of Flying Are Classified.

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 6.—From "the thrill" to "a marked sense of exhilaration, as though he had partaken of good champagne" is the way pathologists and neurologists have classified the sensations received by those who take their first ride in an airplane.

Armed with stethoscopes, sphygmomanometers and other instruments, Doctors Mason W. Pressly, E. G. Goodrich and Reginald F. Grant recently conducted a series of experiments on the effect of airplaning on the human nervous system, and have just made public their report.

"Flying will provide the great boon sought for the treatment of all nervous cases such as neurasthenia, and even paresis," said Dr. Grant. The tests were exhaustive and were made on several patients at a local aviation field.

"We must consider that the aviator is accustomed to flying while this is the passenger's first flight," stated Dr. Grant in opening his report. "He had to go through the various impressions, sensations, mental deductions and anxiety which a first flight

"His anxiety with regard to height and speed having been relieved, there supervenes a feeling of exhilaration—the thrill." Later he may again become a little apprehensive of the descent, and wonder as to whether he will experience water-chute or light sensations. Again, in this, he is greatly surprised. As the plane's nose is pointed down and the engine throttled down, auditory impressions are diminished, but there is no sensation of falling. Near the end of the glide the earth seems to be coming up rapidly to meet the airplane, and the sensation of speed is again increased. As the wheels touch the ground, the vibrations increase and then subside."

And then, according to Dr. Grant, is where the auto-animation comes in. He says: "When the passenger steps out he is conscious of a marked sense of exhilaration, as though he had partaken of good champagne."

The therapeutic effect of airplaning, Dr. Grant summarizes as follows:

"Flying increased the total volume of blood, increased metabolism—the process of converting food into tissue—increased lung ventilation, increased blood pressure and arterial tone, increased the expansibility of the heart and increased hemoglobin, the vital element of the blood which absorbs and carries oxygen."

### NATIONAL ASSEMBLY GIVEN BILL FOR MANY INJURIES.

WEIMAR, Sept. 5.—The National Assembly has received a bill covering reimbursement for personal injury or property losses incurred since the revolution. It provides that those who suffered losses, injury and death have a right to recover from the government. Money claims are limited in the measure to amounts necessary to replace damaged property, to actual expenses in case of personal injury and to grants for loss of labor and for death. The national government, the state and the community are each to bear one-third of the costs.

### SMUGGLING THROUGH ATMOSPHERE LATEST WRINKLE IN WORLD

BUFFALO, Sept. 6.—The wreck on the outskirts of this city of an airplane believed to have come from Canada resulted in the first charge of smuggling through the air in this federal district.

The two members of the airplane crew were not seriously hurt when the machine crashed and left the scene in an automobile soon after the accident. A day later a deputy sheriff was placed on guard over the wreck to restrain souvenir hunters.

The United States customs department subsequently received information that the machine was en route from Toronto to Gloucester, Mass. With no record of duty having been paid, libel proceeding were begun. Five days after the accident no one had appeared to claim the airplane and it was placed in a government warehouse.
