OLDEST COAL FIELD FEMININE PASSES ON

WIGAN, Eng., Sept. 13.—Mrs. Bridget McHugh, the oldest "pit-brow" woman in the Pemberton coal field, has just died here at the age of 89 years. For more than half a century she had worked at the mines. "Old Bridget," as Mrs. McHugh was familiarly called, was a hale and hearty, strongly built woman who could use a shovel in filling mine cars as well as any man and was always looked upon as an expert pit-brow worker, few being her equal.

The shorter working day was unknown to her and Summer and Winter, rain or shine, she was accustomed to leave home at five o'clock every morning, and was in her place at the coal bank before the whistle sounded at six. Her day continued until five or six at night. Mrs. McHugh was a grandmother and two of her sons are employed in the colliery where she worked so long.
