## WILL CONDEMN OLD SIDEWALKS

Immediate Investigation Authorized by City Council of All Old Board Sidewalks—Will Start Proceedings in Near Future

An immediate inspection of the board sidewalks of Klamath Falls by the city street committee will be undertaken with the view of obtaining first-hand information upon which condemnation proceedings can be based, following action of the city council last night in their regular weekly meeting in the council chamber of the city hall.

The opinion of the council was that drastic action was necessary to remedy the problem that has been confronting the city for some time. Likewise proceedings will be instigated where the facts are in hand in order to protect the city from a multiplicity of damage suits for injuries to pedestrians, due to sidewalks being in ill repair.

Police Judge Leavitt was directed to notify the California-Oregon Power Company to install fire hydrants at the junction of Owens and Gardner streets and at the junction of East Main and Gardner streets in Mills addition. Mayor I. R. Struble was instructed to furnish the necessary 10-inch sewer pipe to lay the sewer on Wilmo street, west from Sixth street. The mayor was likewise authorized to repair the Shiplington roadway with cinders hauled free of charge by J. H. Garrett and the county.

Messrs. Collins and Still were granted a permit to construct a three-story brick building with basement at the corner of Fifth and Main streets. John A. Dreher was given permission to build a six-room bungalow on lot 7, block 69, in the Nichols addition. He will likewise build a garage on lot 9 and adjoining his bungalow. The cost of the home and garage is estimated at 3,500. Permit was granted to J. A. Johnson to build a one-story dwelling in Mills addition.

Resolutions were unanimously adopted ordering the construction of cement sidewalks from Center street to the Baldwin hotel on the north side of Main street and on the south side of Third street from Main to Pine streets.

Local Post No. 8 of the American Legion was granted permission to hold monthly meetings in the council chambers of the city hall until further notice.
