COSTS HIGHEST IN STOCKHOLM

Travelers arriving here from Stockholm, after visiting some of the other capitals are firm in their conviction that it is the most expensive city in Europe.

The staple coin is a krona, just over 25 cents, and it costs 32 krona for bed, breakfast and bath in a hotel. The simplest meals cost \$5, and wine is prohibitive at about \$200 a bottle for the worst war champagne. A taxicab for an hour costs \$7.50, and five krona is the customary tip for a meal, while one is expected to give a krona to the man who happens to be handy and insists on opening the door you would rather open yourself.

"I have been in many places these past five years," said a recently returned traveler, "Moscow and Bagdad, Bombay and Saloniki, Cairo and Rome, Paris and Petrograd, London and Monte Carlo, Brussels and Milan and the cheapest of them all was Monte Carlo. Stockholm was the dearest."

KLAMATH FRUIT ON EXHIBITION

Many Varieties of Show Apples Are on Display in Local Store—Cultivation of Fine Fruit Is Being Urged Upon Growers

In appearance some of the finest apples that are grown anywhere are on display in the windows of the Baldwin Hardware Company.

Most of the apples on exhibition are taken from the Ed. Sutton place which is located on the west side of the river. In all 15 varieties are represented in the display, 11 of which are from the Sutton place.

"If only people knew the opportunities for apple culture in Klamath County they would set out hundreds of trees," said Judge Baldwin in talking over the apple situation. "Our Klamath County can raise as a

fine fruit as is grown anywhere. People have failed to grasp the opportunities that are lying about them.

Despite that fact that this is a lean year for fruit, Judge Baldwin declared that he had seen some heavily laden trees in the county. "We can raise fine Arkansas Blacks and Bellflowers in abundance. Nearly all the prune and pear trees that I have seen are heavily laden and the fruit on them is firm and exceptionally large."

Judge Baldwin believes that the county fair is set far too late in the year to allow the best produce in the county to be well exhibited. "Our best apples, peaches and pears have passed their prime in flavor and appearance by October," declared the man who had done much for Klamath County. "If the fair could be held in mid-September we would no doubt see exhibited some of the finest varieties of fruits and produce that are grown anywhere."
