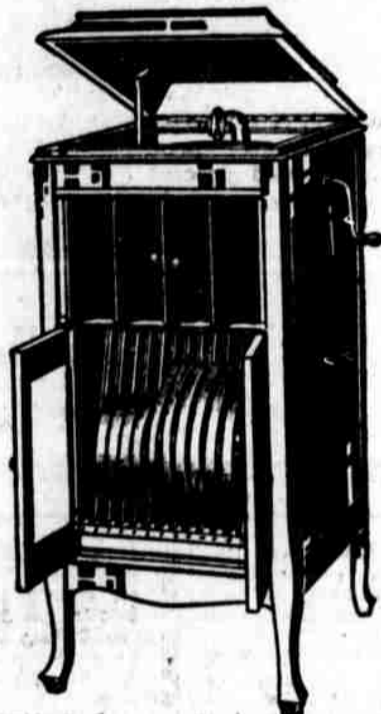

"BUY BARS" SOLUTION TO LIQUOR PROBLEMS

LONDON, Sept. 8. (By Mail)—The latest contribution to the literature on the question of control of the liquor traffic comes from the headquarters of the Labor Party which argues in favor of the labor policy of state municipal purchase. The Labor Party statement adds that "during war time it was found that the only good solution was the scheme of purchase undertaken at Carlisle by the Liquor Control Board. This has been an almost unqualified success. There seems every reason to proceed in this direction, and either nationalize or municipalize the whole of the liquor trade."
