#### RESOLUTION

Approving the Plans, Specifications and Estimates prepared by the City Engineer and filed with the Police Judge for the construction of the Fifth Unit of Sewers for the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, including septic tank and outfall sewer as shown in said Plans, Specifications and Estimates; determining the boundaries within which the property lies that is to be specifically benefited and to be assessed for one-half of the cost of said Fifth Sewer Unit after eliminating therefrom the cost of the septic tank and "outfall" sewer running from the intersection of Owens and Shasta Streets westerly to Lake Ewauna, as shown upon said Plans, Specifications and Estimates; charging the cost of said septic tank, outfall sewer, right of way for outfall sewer and septic tank, and one-half of the cost of remainder of said Fifth Sewer Unit against the City of Klamath Falls and the remainder thereof against the real property specifically benefited by said sewer unit, and ordering the publication of this Resolution:

The City Engineer, pursuant to resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having on the 6th day of October, 1919, filed plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of making and installing the Fifth Sewer Unit of Klamath Falls, Oregon, including a concrete septic tank 85 feet long by 16 feet wide by 11 feet deep, to be located at the intersection of southerly limits of Klamath Falls and the eastern shore of Lake Ewauna, and an outfall sewer running from the intersection of Owens and Shasta Streets westerly to Lake Ewauna, and the Common Council having taken the same under advisement, and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that said plans, specifications and estimates for the making and installation of said Fifth Sewer Unit, including said septic tank and outfall sewer, and the same hereby are approved, and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to make and install said Fifth Sewer Unit, including said septic tank and outfall sewer, and to acquire said rights of way, in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates. Said Fifth Sewer Unit shall consist in laying sewer pipes, "Y" branches, manholes, lampholes, sump and building and septic tank, of the dimensions and kinds of materials shown upon said plans, specifications and estimates, at a total estimated cost of \$59,735.00; that the total cost of said septic tank and sump estimated at \$3,000, the total cost of said outfall sewer heretofore mentioned, estimated at \$5,714.90, the total cost of said rights of way for septic tank and outfall sewer estimated at \$1,299.99, and one-half of the total cost of the remainder of said Fifth Sewer Unit, estimated at \$13,145.99, is to be borne and paid for by the City of Klamath Falls; and the remainder of the cost of said sewer unit estimated at \$21,676.99, to be borne and paid for by the real property specially benefited thereby, and the City of Klamath Falls not to be liable for said amounts above mentioned unless the people thereof by majority vote shall authorize the issuance of bonds of said city to an amount necessary to pay the said city's portion of the cost of said sewer unit, septic tank, outfall sewer and rights of way as aforesaid.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Common Council that the property hereinafter described be, and the same is, hereby declared to be benefited by said sewer unit to-wit:

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Monday, the 3rd day of November, 1919, at the hour of 8 o'clock, p. m., at the Council Chamber in the City Hall at Klamath Falls, be fixed as the time and place for the hearing of objections and remonstrances against the said proposed Fifth Sewer Unit and the Police Judge be, and he is hereby, directed to cause notice of said hearing to be published as by charter provided.

That said Fifth Sewer Unit is to be laid at, in, and along the following places in said district, to-wit:

On Michigan Avenue from its junction with Esplanade Street or Avenue southeasterly to the junction of said Michigan Avenue with Main Street, and from said Michigan Avenue easterly along the south boundary of Lots 4, 5, 6 and 7, Block 53, Second Hot Springs Addition, to the westerly boundary of the U. S. Government Canal right of way; from Michigan Avenue easterly along the south boundary of Lots 1 to 8, Block 55, Second Hot Springs Addition, to junction of El Dorado Avenue and U. S.
