ROAD BUILDING PROJECT DELAYED

NENANA, Alaska, Sept. 25. (By Mail.)—Cutting of the Alaska wagon road appropriation by Congress has resulted in abandonment of plans for building a road connecting the Kantishna district with the government railroad, thus permitting traffic of all kinds to be carried on throughout the year. Congress appropriated \$100,000 for wagon and trail work this year, a sum greatly below that sought by the road building department. Several years ago \$4,000 was spent in the Kantishna district, but mining activities there are said to be more greatly hampered than in any other district in Alaska for lack of a wagon road.

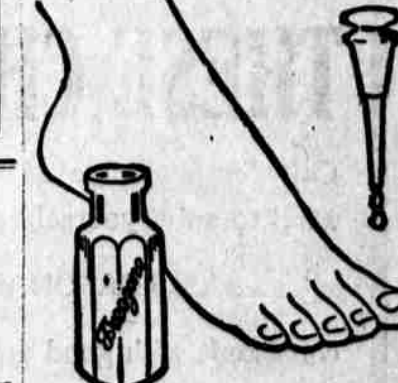
